



# TEXAS

## Full License Checklist

To apply for a full Class C license in Texas, applicants must be at least 18 years old and bring the following documents to a local driver license office:

- Texas Provisional License.** If the student was previously licensed (including a provisional license) in another state, the out-of-state license must be surrendered, or a Texas Department of Public Safety affidavit must be executed certifying the out of state license has been lost, stolen or expired.
- Application.** A completed [DL-14a application form](#) for a Texas driver license or identification card (also available at any driver license office).
- Proof of social security.** One primary identification document (Social Security Card, W-2, SSA-1099 Form, a non-SSA-1099 form or a pay stub with the applicant's name and SSN on it). A military ID (must contain applicant's SSN), Certificate of release or Discharge of Active Duty (DD-214), certified college/university transcript designating number as SSN, health insurance card, Veteran's Administration card or pilot license with identifiable SSN may be also accepted. - Proof of insurance.** If the applicant owns a car, proof of liability insurance and Texas registration is required during the driving test. If not, you must submit a statement affirming that the applicant does not own a motor vehicle.
- Fee.** \$25 (for a first-time non-commercial Class A license; expires every 6 years).
